

Summer film series opens Friday

LAMBERTVILLE — Nickelodeon Nights is back for a second summer season of outdoor film events.

This summer's season kicks off Friday, June 15, at 7:30 p.m. with the classic 1954 underwater mystery-adventure, "20,000 Leagues Under the Sea."
